When we began the merger process, it was clear my role would change. However, ensuring continuity of support for our participants and job security for our staff made this merger vital for OCC.

With the expected freeze in NDIS funding, uncertainty from the NDIS review, outcomes of the Royal Commission, and government pressure for consolidation, merging became the strategic direction OCC needed to secure its future.

Since 1950, OCC has adapted, weathered many storms, and embraced change to better serve our participants, families, and staff. This merger is another step in ensuring we continue to fulfill our mission and remain relevant.

In August, a long-term and valued colleague visited my office to reflect on all we've achieved over the last decade. Together, we turned our financial position around, undertook a massive redevelopment project, successfully transitioned to the NDIS, doubled in size, navigated the immense challenges of COVID, and now, embarked on a merger.

As a team, we created the Participant Reference Group, worked with three different board chairs, developed strategic plans, and launched new initiatives like the Hubs for Day Support and eco products at OCCE. We've managed seven external quality audits, embedded OH&S, and advocated tirelessly for better supports for people with disabilities.

But beyond these achievements, what I value most are the memories and lessons I've gained. I've been deeply moved by the courage of our participants and families as they face life's challenges with such resilience and a determination to embrace life fully.

I'm also inspired by our staff, who despite their own responsibilities and challenges at home—whether it's parenting, caregiving, or dealing with illness—show up every day with unwavering dedication to those we support. Thank you for your guidance, support, and for teaching me so much.

# DISABILITY SECTOR ORGANISATIONS RAISE THE ALARM ON NDIS MARKET FAILURE

OC Connections and other disability sector organisations are raising alarms over a potential market failure in the NDIS due to inadequate funding from the recent NDIA pricing review.

The pricing decision has led many service providers to reconsider their participation in the sector, threatening the availability of quality supports for people with disabilities.

The alliance calls for immediate action, including increased prices for support coordination and therapy, reinstatement of high-intensity payments, and a loading for registered providers to sustain services.
